<i>Dactylorhiza elata</i>	Robust Marsh-orchid	wet patches	near Sado		very rare
<i>Gennaria diphyllea</i>	Two-leaved Gennaria	scrub, pine wd	SA, CV, CA	most limest.	locally common
<i>Himantoglossum robertianum</i>	Giant Orchid	garssland roadside	SA, less AI	limestone	scarce
<i>Limodorum abortivum</i>	Violet Bird's-nest	wd and scrub	SA, Ba	limestone	scarce
<i>Limodorum trabitianum</i>	Spurless Violet bird's-nest	pinewoods	SA	limestone	very rare
<i>Neotinea maculata</i>	Dense-flowered Orchid	all wds, scrub, grasInd	throughout	all soils	uncommon
<i>Neotinea conica</i>	Conical Orchid	rocky limestone	Ba, SA	limestone	scarce

<i>Orchis olbiensis</i>	Spanish Early Purple-orchid*	open wdlnd, grassland	Ba, SA	limestone	very local
<i>Orchis italica</i>	Naked-man Orchid	dry grasslnds roadsides	SA, Ba, less Al	limestone	locally common
<i>Serapias strictiflora</i>	Sharp-lipped Tongue Orchid*	dry/wet grasslnd	coastal, CV, SA	all soils	locally common
<i>Serapias parviflora</i>	Small-lipped Tongue Orchid*	dry/wet grasslnd	throughout	all soils	fairly common
<i>Serapias cordigera</i>	Heart-lipped Tongue Orchid*	dry/wet grasslnd	SA, CV, CA, Ba	most limestone	locally frequent
<i>Serapias lingua</i>	Tongue Orchid	wet grasslnd	most Al, Ba	acidic	frequent
<i>Spiranthes spiralis</i>	Autumn Lady's-tresses	all woodland	Ba, CV, SA	all	uncommon
<i>Spiranthes aestivalis</i>	Summer Lady's-tresses	water courses	Ba, CV, AL	all	scarce
